Principal's Message

Mark 10: 35-45: In Sunday's Gospel, James and John ask Jesus about whether or not they will be sitting with Him in the Kingdom. Jesus explains to them that it is God who gives us a place in heaven. Jesus explains that: "The Son of Man did not come to be served: he came to serve and to give his life to redeem." Jesus gives us a different model of leadership. Rather than seeking power, influence and wealth, he calls us to lead through humble service.

World Teachers Day: World Teachers' Day is celebrated on 26th October in Australia; however, we will be celebrating it on Wednesday, 24th October at St Mary's School.

As parents, you will all instinctively know, the impact individual teachers have on a child's education can be great. Teachers are central to learning and, while there are other important factors, including the quality of the curriculum, school environment and student ability and commitment, it is teachers that breathe life into what is being taught and who engage and motivate students.

Each one of us, if asked, could most likely name special teachers that impacted our learning. Class News

Year One Religion Corner

To start the term in Religion in Year One, we are completing a unit called A Wonderful World. The unit begins with the discovery and exploration of creation, which leads us to wonder at God who gave people the gift of the created universe and the ability to enjoy creation.

Then the unit explores ways Jesus wants people to experience the joy of creation as he did. To pray like him and to give thanks and to appreciate and care for creation as Jesus wants us to.

Year Three Class News

It has been a busy start to Term Four in the Year Three Class.

We have started lots of different topics. In **Numeracy** we are learning about volume and capacity and spent a lesson in the sun using water to find the capacity of different containers. In *Literacy* we been focusing on our knowledge of grammar and have written some fantastic holiday stories. We had to base our stories on real events from the holidays but then we added in some funny, outrageous things that didn't really happened. Some children were mistaken for lollie shop managers, some people's Grandma's became famous explorers and others met talking mermaids. We are also investigating where food comes from in **TECHNOLOGY**, the way our cities and towns are run in <u>Civics and citizenship</u> and what it means to speak from the heart in *Religion*. It is going to be a fantastic, crazy and extremely busy term in Year Three !!

Italian News

This term in Italian, students will be learning about the following concepts:

- Animals- names of, foods eaten
- Calendars- days, months, seasons
- The Weather
- Telling the Time
- Parts of the Body
- Christmas

Students will continue to practise their speaking and listening skills by completing short conversation activities each week with a partner and in small groups. We will also continue to watch episodes of 'MUZZY' at the conclusion of each lesson, to continue to develop our Italian listening skills. Students will play a variety of board games and complete different hands-on activities throughout the term.

Waste Wise News

Our groundwater system in Perth remains vital to meeting our water needs, making up about 46% of our total water supply. To secure our supply and ensure sustainability we are investing in new expanded deep groundwater network. This will allow us to transfer our take to the deeper aquifers so that our groundwater use will not affect the natural environment.

Aquifers are mostly composed of sand, sandstone and limestone, but they can also be made of gravel, heavily fractured granite, or any other rock material that has enough connected spaces to store and move water through it. It's here we take water from the ground and feed it into our water supply.

Water has been accessed over the past 10 years from the coastal aquifers that would otherwise have discharged into the ocean. Use of underground water from the superficial inland aquifers has reduced, lessening impacts on some of our wetlands and lakes that are supported by the aquifer. We now rely on the superficial inland aquifers in the very driest of years and only for about 10% of our supply needs.


