Principal's Message

Mark 5: 1-12: In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus challenges us to seek true and lasting happiness. He points to the virtues of gentleness, humility, justice and peacemaking as the way to eternal joy. These are the qualities of the saints who have gone before us.

All Saints Day: All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, All Saints' Day observances tend to focus on known saints --that is those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church. The Year Four class led us in a beautiful Mass on Wednesday in honour of All Saints Day.

All Souls Day: Today we celebrate All Souls Day. This is a holy day set aside for honouring those who have died. Traditionally, the whole month of November is set aside to honour the dead.

Caritas Visit and Just Leadership: On Wednesday, 31st October Deacon Paul Reid and Anita Finneran from Caritas visited St Mary's School to thank the community for their support of Caritas and to present a Just Leadership session to the Year Five and Year Six students.

Canteen Survey: Thank you to all the families who took the time to respond to the canteen survey which was sent out in Term Three – your input has been much appreciated. The main points to come out of the survey was that the community saw the canteen as a service provided by the school and that due to a variety of reasons volunteers were hard to come by. We have been very lucky at St Mary's to have such a committed and enthusiastic group of canteen coordinators in 2018 who have been well supported by volunteers from the school community. Through the Canteen, the P&F has raised much needed funds for the school. However, after much discussion at P&F and School Board level, it has been decided that in 2019 responsibility for the Canteen would be given to the School and a paid coordinator would be employed to run the canteen. An advert for this position will be going into the next issue of The Phoenix. If you know of someone who would be suitable or is interested in this position, please encourage them to apply.

Parking: With the increased truck traffic on South Avenue due to harvest beginning in the area could I please ask families to use the designated parking areas within the school. We have noticed an increase in the number of parents parking on South Avenue outside the front of the school. This is dangerous at the best of times as it blocks line of sight, decreases space on the road and has the potential to cause an accident when people are getting in and out of cars. Parking is available on the school grounds in front of the office (PK to Year One families) or at the side of the school (access through the Church carpark). 


All Souls Day

Term Four is well and truly upon us and we have been learning all sorts of new skills and using lots of new equipment. In the first part of this term we have all been learning about Lawn Bowls, with our Sporting for Schools money allowing us to purchase a Jack Attack pack. The pack came equipped with bowling balls, jacks, bowling mats, markers and a scoring mat. We have been having lots of fun learning about lawn bowls and all the names of the different equipment. The children have been loving challenging each other in little game situations.

In the second part of this term we will moving onto Table Tennis with equipment also purchased through the Sporting for Schools grant. It is great to be able to provide our students with opportunities to be exposed to new sports and to learn specific skills.

Waste Wise Gardens

Grouping plants with similar watering needs is an effective way to conserve water in the garden and give each plant the best conditions.

Good soil is the best foundation of a healthy garden and will provide the best conditions for your plants to use less water. Improving the soil is a good investment when planting as WA commonly has sandy soils that have a low water and nutrient holding capacity.

It is important to improve the soil when you're planting and maintaining your garden by thoroughly mixing organic matter and soil improver into the top 30 cm of soil.

You can also find soil improvers that contain wetting agents, which help water penetrate to the roots of your plants. Established lawns and gardens can also benefit from soil improvement.


